The table currently displays the highest risk category for WPC's Day 1-3 probabilistic excessive rainfall, heavy snow, and freezing rain forecasts. In addition, there is a link to WPC's medium range hazards page, which depicts the potential for impactful weather out to Day 7. Excessive Rainfall Risk Categories and Corresponding Probabilities (More Info):

MARGINAL	2-5%
SLIGHT	5-10%
MODERATE	10-15%
HIGH	>15%

Heavy Snow (≥ 4 inches) Risk Categories and Corresponding Probabilities (More Info):

Risk Category	Probability of at Least 4 Inches of Snow Accumulation
SLIGHT	10-40%
MODERATE	40-70%
HIGH	>70%

Freezing Rain (≥ 0.25 inches) Risk Categories and Corresponding Probabilities (More Info):

Risk Category	Probability of at Least 0.25 Inches of Ice Accumulation
SLIGHT	10-40%
MODERATE	40-70%
HIGH	>70%
